CELEBRATIONS AT LANNER

Christ Church, Lanner, was built in 1839 as a chapel of ease to the Mother Church of Gwennap, and on St. Swithun's Day, 1845, a separate ecclesiastical parish of Lannarth was carved out of Gwennap, the patron and first vicar being the Rev. John Tucker, M.A., who held the living until his death in 1870. He was followed by his son, the Rev. George Wm. Tucker, M.A., who remained, however, only one year. Other incumbents have been: Joseph Bartholomew Davey Hopgood, M.A., 1871-78; William Baillie Wallace, 1871-78; William Baillie Wallace, 1878-1904; Lyttleton Fitzgerald, 1904-05; Frank Buckler, M.A. (nephew of the first patron), 1905-10; Charles Salmon Paddon, M.A., 1910-16; William Henry Castell Malton, B.A., 1916-22; Edward Wyvill Stuart, 1922-24; Fenton Ernest Bury, M.A., 1924-28; Oliver Roland Walkey, 1928-30; Percy Edward Henthorn Stott, 1930-35; Clement Thomas Walker, M.A., 1935-37; George Frederick Sandfield, 1938-40; William Henry Greening, 1940-44, and the present vicar (the Rev. L. E. Glascott). The following served in the parish vicar (the Rev. L. E. Glascott). The following served in the parish between 1880 and 1904 as curates: Canon A. J. Mason and the Revs. F. J. Scott, W. Foster, C. H. Shaw, F. Thomas, A. Darnell, and H. Wright. Three former incumbents still hold livings in Cornwall, the Rev. P. E. H. Stott being rector of Ruanlamihorne with Philleigh; the Rev. C. T. Walker, vicar of St. Stephens-by-Saltash, and the Rev. G. F. Sandfield, rector of Camborne. A fourth (the Rev. O. R. Walkey) is living in retirement near St. Keverne. Keverne.
